Dear Parents



We shared our classroom once again with our parents, thank you to those of you who were able to attend and join in with our activities!






























Pre-School



Pre-School Purley

It has been wonderful to see and hear how much our children like the plants around our world. They are very confident in talking about what seeds need to grow. They have planted cress seeds and are

caring for them until they are ready to eat. The tiny seed story was a wonderful book to look at and discover what happened to the many seeds on their journey across the world.

We had a fun yoga session with P2P and Kindergarten. It is so lovely to be together and see our children interact and enjoy learning together.

Our sound "sh" was greeted with excitement as many of our names start with this sound. It is lovely to see how well our children are doing with our first readers and rhyming families interactive readers.

Our children love doing paint the squares on Topmarks along with adding groups of different objects.

Our classroom is filled with beautiful flowers made by our creative children showing all the parts of the plant. Well done children. We made flower soup and decorated our trees with wildflowers. Our decorated trees look fabulous.













Pre-School South Croydon

This week in Pre-School South Croydon we have been learning about the lifecycle of a flower. We were lucky enough to have Mrs Saul bring some plants from her house to see how they are growing, and they will be put in the wellbeing garden when they are strong enough, we also had a video of

Mrs Saul in her greenhouse showing us lots of different plant stages. At the beginning of the week, we were very lucky with the weather and planted some of our own sunflowers, which we will grow and put in the wellbeing garden. The children were able to sequence the stages of planting a flower and learnt the names of parts of the flower. Within Maths we have been learning how to add 2 groups of objects together by adding children to the bus as we go for a trip to Tesco.

On Friday we celebrated African World Heritage Day, Miss Frank brought in some traditional clothing for us to see and spoke about her hometown in Uganda.













Pathway to Pre-School

This week in P2P we have been learning about the lifecycle of a seed. The children have looked at how a plant starts as a seed and then grows roots, a stem, leaves, a bud and eventually a flower.

They even learnt 'The Seed Song', and sang about how a seed needs air, water and sunshine. P2P had the opportunity to plant their own cress, which they really enjoyed doing. We have been checking them every day to see how well they are growing, and they are really excited to bring them home.

In forest school, the children picked buttercups and daisies, and stuck them to the trees to decorate it. P2P have been making the most of the lovely sunshine and going outside to learn about their environment as much as they can!













In keeping with the theme of plant lifecycles, our role play area has been transformed into a farm shop. The class have been having fun role playing as shopkeepers and customers where they could pretend to buy different fruits and vegetables, and beginning to use money.

During the week, the children also explored different herbs such as mint, rosemary, basil and others, by using their senses to describe the smell and touch of them. They even had a go at cutting them and making perfumes and potions!

Kindergarten



Kindergarten South Croydon

This week we have started looking into how flowers grow. We've have been creating our own lovely flower arrangements in the play dough and filling and emptying pots with soil. We have created

some lovely butterfly art to display on our window for when the sun shines in. The children have taken such an interest in how things grow and change and the end result and are doing brilliant at being able to remember what comes first then next and last in a life cycle of a seed to a flower. We are watching our caterpillars everyday, and they are changing so much. The children are fascinated to see how much they have changed and use words to describe them such as "they are really long" "they look very fat" "they are wiggly".









Kindergarten Purley

This week we have been very busy discovering our green fingers and talking about seeds and plants and discovering everything they need to successfully grow.

We started by filling wellington boots with soil, ready to plant our strawberry plants, the children were asked what we needed to do next and they correctly said we needed to water them, they are now on our tree trunk, so we can watch them grow.

We have planted some flowers and seeds to hopefully grow a sweet pea tepee, while planting our tomatoes and peppers Mrs Hollands showed the children the roots to the plants before some of the children planted them. The teachers decided that maybe Mrs Hollands was having too much fun! The children have been amazing remembering to water the plants every day.

We also planted individual bulbs with our mums and dads during our Show and Share session, so that each child has their own plant to care for.
