Contact

Contact is about the risk of harm young people may face when interacting with other users online. This includes things like peer-to-peer pressure or seeing inappropriate commercial advertising. Sometimes adults pose as children or young adults with the intention of grooming or exploiting a child or young person.

In school, we teach pupils that online friends should be people they know in real life.

Pupils are reminded about the importance of not sharing personal information online.

We teach pupils about their online code of conduct and share rules for safe internet use.

Older pupils are taught about their digital footprint and the positives and negatives of being online.

Links with physical and mental well-being are made connected to screen time.
