# Important Nursery and Reception After School Care - Purley

Over the Spring Term we have reviewed **After School Care at Purley** as it was over subscribed every day. As it has our nursery children attending it is important we staff this correctly to keep all the children safe. Organising staff on an ad hoc basis was not so we made a decision to remove online ad hoc bookings. We have asked parents where possible to book in advance and these bookings closed last week.

If you still need After School Club at Purley and have not booked and want to make a block booking or a booking for a specific day/ time please email <u>nursery@cumnorhouse.com</u> detailing clearly your child's full name, class and day and hours you need. We will confirm within 48 hours if this is possible and send a payment link.

If you need an ad hoc booking this term you can call (please try and give us as much notice as possible) and request a space, however, we can not guarantee a space will be available but will try and accommodate where possible. Payment will then need to be made to keep this place.

We are aware that this has an impact on some parents, however, we are hopeful that this new model ensures we have enough staff to run the after school facility.

### \*Children must not attend this After School Care Club if you have not booked in advance.

Unfortunately yesterday we had 10 children in after school care who did not book in and if this continues we will need to introduce a non-booking charge which we do not want to do.




# Reception

**Pre-School Purley** 

A busy week with our activities on Earth Day, St George's day and our lifecycle of a chicken which included looking at naming Oviparous animals who lay eggs. As part of our learning we are choosing materials to wrap and protect our eggs for our egg roll activity in Forest School.

For Earth Day we made a giant Earth with our helping hands and talked about how we can care for our Earth by recycling and making sure we use reusable bags and water bottles.

We cheered on St George in his battle against the dragon.

Our children met our baby caterpillars who are 8 days old and beginning to spin silk. So lovely to have this opportunity to observe caterpillars closely as they transform.

Our family display is looking lovely with the addition of each child's baby photo....how you have grown children.

It was lovely to see how delighted our children were with their reading book to take home.

Our children are enjoying meeting rhyming families and finding out about the vowel family. They love our vowel bat song.

#### **Pre-School South Croydon**

This week in Pre-School we have had a fun packed week. On Monday we celebrated Earth Day and spoke about how to help the Earth and take care of it, we used pipettes with coloured water to create mini Earth's. On Tuesday we celebrated St Georges Day, we learnt the story about St George and the pattern on the flag, we decorated our own bunting to go around the castle, knight and dragon tuff tray. We coloured and cut out some stick puppets and did our own puppet shows for our friends. We have also been learning about the chicken lifecycle and reflecting back to when he had the chicks in the classroom, alongside this we have learnt about other animals that come from eggs.









# Pathway to Pre-School



It has been another fun filled week in Pathway to Pre-School.

We started off the week celebrating Earth Day and learning about how important it is to look after the world we live in. The children enjoyed making Earth Day superhero pasta necklaces using their

fine motor skills. We also focused on how to look after the Earth and learnt about recycling and looking after sea animals. On Tuesday we celebrated St Georges Day. We made some lovely St Georges Day flags using different red and white materials.

We have continued our theme of lifecycles and have been looking at the lifecycle of oviparous animals such as different birds and reptiles. The children had the opportunity to make their own chicken lifecycle. They carefully cut out the pictures and stuck them in the correct order.

The children finished the week taking part in an experiment to choose a strong material to wrap around their egg, which would protect it from cracking. They then tested their eggs by rolling them on the floor in forest school.

We have also been looking at lifecycles this week, talking and exploring how things change as they grow, sometimes changing completely and being unrecognisable from when they were born.
